Lingon A runner in broken twill

Table runners are a staple in Sweden and many are woven a little bit warp faced and frequently with the warp dominant only on the right side. This one is woven in broken twill, which gives it a nice hand. The red stripes are reminiscent of the tasty lingon berries. Cottolin gives the perfect combination of ease of weaving and ease of use. The wide light natural colored stripe has both unbleached and 1/2 bleached wound together, threaded randomly, a common feature, which is both beautiful and practical. Note the color choice in the gray and white colored stripes, which is the half bleached cottolin, giving a lighter glow to these stripes.

The runner is woven in broken twill, at approximately 28 wefts per inch.

Threading draft




Treadle tie-up *Counterbalance and countermarch looms:* tie up the black squares so that those shafts go down and the other shafts will rise. *Jack looms:* tie the white squares in the tie-up draft to make those shafts rise.
